# "Language Proficiency as a precondition for academic exchange: current challenges and strategies on digital language learning and teaching"

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Despite the perceptible decline during the last decades, humans still use more than 5,000 languages to master their daily life: multilingualism is a fact, not just a figure. Therefore it is not surprising that proficiency in foreign languages is a must for communication and cooperation on an international level. At the same time we observe that the use of a single lingua franca – as it is frequently suggested in the case of English – is not sufficient to guarantee real understanding. Moreover, the Lissabon agenda goal of second language proficiency for Electrizens proves the importance of languages both for communication and identity.



In this context the panel aims to discuss the core influence language proficiency exerts on academic mobility and exchange. On the basis of selected key questions, the podium will discuss needs and challenges of language acquisition at universities and point out current strategies to raise awareness of language issues, aimed at students, university administration, exchange organisations and politics. In the statements, public policies & strategies regarding language acquisition and digitalisation will be complemented by examples put in practice by the panel's attendees.
